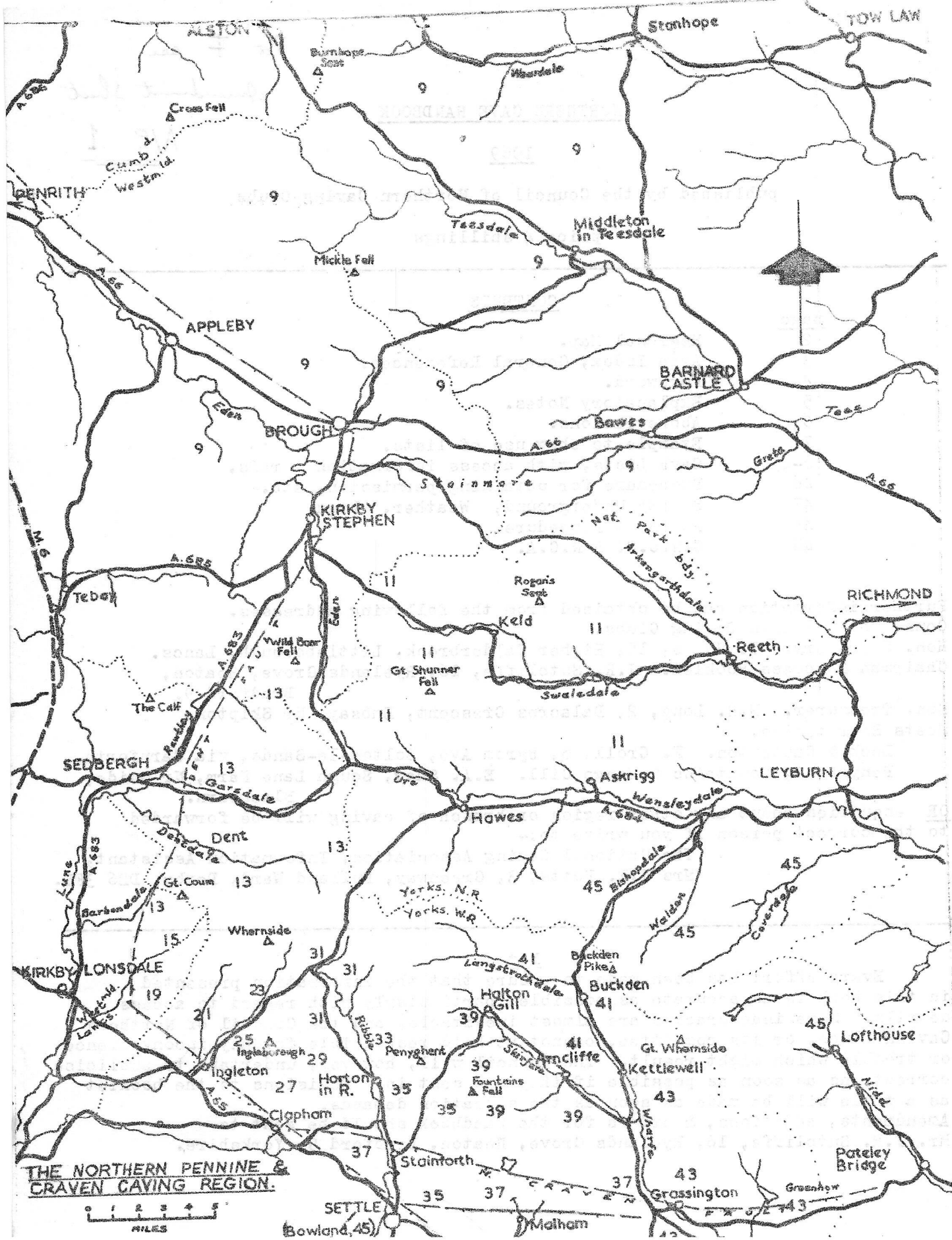

FOREWORD.

There is a popular misconception that all farmers are antagonistic towards potholers on principle, and should therefore be avoided as much as possible. Although the first half of the statement has perhaps become a half-truth in recent years, lack of contact with the farmers can only have aggravated their attitude. Progress, in the shape of the C.N.C.C., the earlier editions of this book, and a wider appreciation of "what's gooin' on", has halted the deterioration of relations. Many Dales farmers are surprisingly co-operative, and actively or passively encourage potholing. The word is CO-operative, you'll notice, implying a responsibility on your part to ensure that none of your activities causes risk or damage to the farmer's land, stock, walls, implements or buildings. All it needs is a little forethought and commonsense, and if you're light on either of these commodities, brother, you shouldn't be going potholing anyway!

Spare a thought for the chap who earns a living on the land you use for recreation. Imagine how you would react to having him clumping through your workshop or office on his way to a football match. Like it or not, that's a parallel situation!

Now, this National Park business. The psycho. boys have been using the word "conditioning" a lot lately; you and I have been conditioned all our lives to think of a Park as a municipally owned, public open space. There may also be lingering impressions in our subconscious of National Geographic Magazine articles about Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, and other American National Parks, State or Federal owned wide-open spaces where man may roam freely without fear of offence to any landowner. In England and Wales - not so. Here, the designation of an area as a National Park effects no change in the ownership of land, it merely gives the Planning Authority powers to control development so that natural beauty and facilities for recreation are preserved. The land is not 'nationalised' or brought into public ownership, and designation confers upon the public no right of access - and that explains, in a nutshell, why it has been found desirable to produce this book. To seek permission is, apart from anything else, a courtesy. In ninety-nine cases out of a hundred, the courtesy will be appreciated and returned. Try it (as the TV commercials say) and taste the difference! And if you're the hundredth - go try again.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. Objects of the book

The Handbook replaces the publication "Permission to Explore Northern Caves and Potholes" which was compiled by the Cave Rescue Organisation in 1963 and later reprinted by the C.R.C.C. The number of new entries and amendments became too great to issue separately and a revised booklet was felt to be necessary. A secondary purpose has been to incorporate information about references and records which could be of use to those exploring or studying any particular cave or area.

2. Order

The caves and potholes are listed in areas which appear, generally speaking, in North to South order through the caving region (see Index and Map, pages 2 and 3). All the relevant information for each cave is presented on the same and facing pages.

3. Layout

For each cave, listed on the right-hand page, the following information (if known) is presented:-

- (i) National Grid Reference (6 figure) of the entrance, (with key letters for the relevant 10km. grid square at the head of each column.)
- (ii) Address where application should be made for permission indicated by a lettered reference to the list on the left-hand facing page.
Read the notes on 'Procedure for obtaining permission' on page 46
- (iii) Surveys of the cave system known to have been carried out indicated by the grade (if known), the club to which the surveyor(s) belonged, and the year in which the survey was made.
The generally accepted Cave Research Group grading system of numbers (and letters, in more recent work) has been used, as quoted by the surveyors themselves or where information is available about the instruments used. In some instances, an 'assumed grade', followed by a question mark, has been stated.
Grade 1 surveys, i.e. sketch plans, have only been mentioned where they have been published, without a written description, and nothing more useful is available.
Explanation of the initials used, etc. can be found under 'Abbreviations' on page 6.
- (iv) References to published surveys and the most useful descriptions indicated by a number which refers to the 'Bibliography' on the facing page. If no published description is known, the reader is referred to the most recent edition of "Pennine Underground" (see General Bibliography, page 3).
The approximate scale of a published survey is indicated by stating (in brackets) the number of feet represented by one inch on the plan (or section, where this is more informative).

Where a survey is known to have been made but not published, copies are presumed to exist only in the records of the club or individuals concerned. In a few cases, these may be available for examination or copying but no indication of this can be given.

Where more than one descriptive reference is mentioned, the most recent publication is usually the most complete. A prefix 'p' indicates that only a part, or an extension, of the system is covered.

References are not always included to published surveys which have been incorporated in, or superceded by, more recent work. Note. Regardless of grade, small scale surveys (more than 50' to 1") rarely include passage detail.

PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING PERMISSION

1. For each area listed, names and addresses of farmers, landowners, etc. are indicated by a lettered cross-reference.
2. In most cases, the address is that of a farmer and it is usually sufficient to call on the way to caves, unless otherwise stated. Clubs may wish to write in advance in some cases, telling the farmer of the intended visit and stating that if a reply is necessary, postage will be refunded.
3. When applying by letter, because the landowner's address is some distance from the caving area, or because written permission is always required, (I) give as much notice as possible;
(II) send a stamped addressed envelope if you expect a reply;
(III) if possible, indicate the number in your party and the name of the leader.
4. Certain popular potholes, such as Bar Pot, get booked up months in advance. For areas where access is controlled by the Council of Northern Caving Clubs, it is advisable for clubs to apply early in the year. Because of the big demand (particularly for Casterton and Leck Fells) the number of dates granted may have to be limited and it is necessary that clubs should be paid up members of the C.N.C.C. or another regional council.

ON THE WAY TO CAVES AND POTHOLE

1. Call on the farmer(s) whose land you have to cross, whether he has had prior notice of your visit or not.
2. Tell him who you are, where you are going and how long you expect to be. Ask him which way he wants you to go and whether he wants you to call when leaving.
3. Adhere to paths or routes indicated, close gates behind you, avoid climbing walls, and avoid disturbing sheep in the lambing season - in other words, follow the Country Code.
4. When crossing heather moor, stick close to walls to avoid disturbing grouse, and do not drop lighted matches or cigarette ends. A fire on a dry moor can kill the roots in peat: the heather will take years to recover.

ON LEAVING A POTHOLE OR CAVE

1. Replace any rocks, timber, or wire which cover the entrance to prevent sheep falling down or to keep out foxes and dogs.
2. Take away with you all litter, including old clothing.
3. Call on farmer or gamekeeper to report that your party has left his land.
4. Report anything abnormal that you may have noticed, such as dead or injured livestock, newly collapsed walls, etc.

SAFETY UNDERGROUND

For guidance on potholing equipment, the correct use of it, and general procedure underground, reference should be made to one of the books mentioned under 'General References, on Page 3. The following points are worth stressing:-

1. If you have doubts about the fitness or competence of your party, don't go.
2. Make sure everyone is adequately dressed, fed, and equipped for the proposed trip.
3. Take note of the weather situation and forecast, together with the present state of streams etc. A large number of caves and potholes flood seriously. Run-off from the fells can be very fast, storms and heavy showers can be very local, and a sudden thaw can melt snow in winter (See 'Local Weather Forecasts' below).
4. Leave full information with someone on the surface about where you are going and for how long.
5. Test ladders, belays and ropes on the surface before using underground. Check them frequently for damage, wear or corrosion.
6. Beware of the possibility of accidents or of situations developing from which rescue will be necessary.

The main causes of accidents are;

- (a) Exposure and exhaustion;
- (b) Falls on ladder pitches and traverses (test belays and use lifeline always).
- (c) Flooding, affecting pitches and low crawls;
- (d) Losing the route and light-failure;
- (e) Loose boulders and tight places.

LOCAL WEATHER FORECASTS

The C.N.C.C. is now able to provide, with the co-operation of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Warden and the Meteorological Office, up to date forecasts specifically for the main potholing area. These would be obtained by the Head Warden on Friday and Saturday evenings, each weekend, and displayed outside the Spindletree Cafe, Clapham, inside the Information Centre at Clapham, when open, on the notice board at the Police Station at Ingleton, and at the Penyghent Cafe, Horton-in-Ribblesdale. The forecast would also be available by telephone from the Warden at Airton 256 between 6.30 & 10 p.m. on Fridays, or from the Penyghent Cafe, Horton 257.

Potholers should, of course, remember that such forecasts will not be infallible and that the final judgement on whether it is safe to go underground must be their own.

DIGS AND STREAM DIVERSIONS

Haphazard digging for caves is probably the major cause of ill-feeling amongst farmers towards potholers.

1. Always obtain permission to commence a new dig, re-open a blocked hole or divert a stream from its natural course,
2. Securely cover any hole into which livestock could fall.

PROCEDURE IN THE EVENT OF AN ACCIDENT

1. The leader of the party must assess the situation and decide whether the accident is of a minor nature and can be dealt with by his own party, or whether the services of the Cave Rescue Organisation are required.
2. Competent persons should be sent out to call out the C.R.O. They should take as much information as possible about the state of the casualty and the circumstances of the accident.
3. Never underestimate the possible injuries or the difficulties of rescue.
4. The only way to call out the C.R.O. is to telephone

5. Details asked for by the police will include:-
 - (a) Name and area of cave or pot, and position of casualty in it;
 - (b) Name, age and address of person(s) injured;
 - (c) Name of club and number in the party;
 - (d) Condition of casualty and details of clothing;
 - (e) General conditions in the pot and on the surface.
6. The party underground should give First Aid and make the patient comfortable and warm. If feasible, and especially if the casualty can assist himself, a start should be made to move the patient towards the surface. Exposure and shock are more likely to prove fatal than further physical damage caused by moving him. The casualty should never be left alone and he should be belayed if his position is insecure.

C.N.C.C. and N.C.A.

The Council of Northern Caving Clubs was founded in 1963 primarily to negotiate access to caves and potholes on land which had been closed to potholers. All the recognised potholing clubs in the North are now members of the Council. In addition to maintaining access to caves, its aims include the development of good relations with farmers, landowners and the public in general, the dissemination of information to its member clubs, and liaison with other bodies and other caving regions. The clubs based in the South, Derbyshire, Mendip and South Wales have formed similar councils.

The National Caving Association has been formed by the regional councils to represent caving clubs at national level. So that all interests are covered, the scientific bodies and the Cave Rescue Council have been incorporated.
